

2025 General Undergraduate Admissions Charter of

Kunming University

I. Nature and Address of the University

Kunming University is a public full-time institution of higher education approved by the Ministry of Education of the People's Republic of China.

Main Campus: No. 2 Puxin Road, Kunming Economic and Technological Development Zone, Kunming City, Yunnan Province;

Kunshi Road Campus: No. 2 Kunshi Road, Wuhua District, Kunming City, Yunnan Province.

II. Disciplinary Categories, Institution-running Type, Educational Level and National Institutional Code

(I) Disciplinary Categories: The University covers 11 disciplinary categories, namely Economics, Law, Education, Literature, History, Science, Engineering, Agronomy, Medicine, Management and Arts.

(II) Institution-running Type: Public full-time general institution of higher education.

(III) Educational Level: Authorized to offer postgraduate and undergraduate academic education.

(IV) National Institutional Identification Code: 4153011393.

III. Organizational Structure

(I) The University establishes an Admission Leading Group, which is responsible for examining and approving admission examination policies, researching major admission-related matters, and exercising its functions in policy consultation and democratic supervision.

(II) Under the leadership of the Admission Leading Group, the Admissions and Employment Office implements national admission policies and provisions, and takes charge of organizing and conducting the University's undergraduate admission work in detail.

(III) The University's Discipline Inspection and Supervision Office shall conduct full-process supervision over all admission activities.

IV. Admission Quotas

(I) In light of national economic and social development demands, combined with the University's actual conditions including talent cultivation capacity and campus operation resources, the University comprehensively determines provincial (autonomous regional, municipal) and major-specific admission quotas by taking into account student source distribution across provinces (autonomous regions and municipalities), graduate employment and further education outcomes, coordinated regional development, key national supportive policies, and historical quota data.

(II) Provincial (autonomous regional, municipal) and major-specific admission quotas shall be subject to the official release by the admission examination authorities of each province (autonomous region or municipality).

(III) Any adjustment to admission quotas during the admission period shall be implemented only after obtaining approval from the competent education authority through prescribed formal procedures.

V. Admission Principles

(I) Throughout the admission process, all national admission policies and provincial (autonomous regional, municipal) admission regulations shall be strictly enforced. The University adheres to the principles of fairness, impartiality and openness, conducts comprehensive assessment of applicants in morality, intelligence, physical fitness, aesthetics and labor education, and admits candidates on merit.

(II) The University recognizes and fully implements the bonus point policies issued by the Ministry of Education and all provincial (autonomous regional, municipal) admission examination institutes (admission offices).

(III) The University accepts the file submission rules formulated by provincial (autonomous regional, municipal) admission authorities. For candidates whose files are received, major allocation shall follow the principle of “score priority with voluntary preference compliance” in accordance with respective admission batches. Candidates shall be ranked in descending order of their submitted examination scores, and assigned majors based on their personal voluntary preferences and available admission quotas. No major grade differential shall be applied between different majors.

(IV) Candidates from provinces (autonomous regions and municipalities) implementing comprehensive college entrance examination reform must satisfy the subject selection requirements specified by the University for their target majors.

(V) In the event of identical submitted scores, major allocation shall follow the equal-score ranking rules stipulated by the respective province (autonomous region or municipality).

(VI) For candidates who fail to meet the admission requirements of all their filled voluntary preferences: those who consent to major adjustment shall be reassigned to unfilled majors within the same academic category or major group of their submitted batch. For provinces (autonomous regions or municipalities) that directly submit files to individual majors without grouping, inter-major adjustment is not available. Candidates who cannot be admitted to any filled major and decline major adjustment shall have their files withdrawn.

(VII) Applicants for English-related majors shall take and pass the oral English test of each province (autonomous region or municipality) if such test is uniformly organized by their respective admission examination institutes (admission offices). English majors only recruit candidates whose foreign language subject is English. For the admission of other majors, there is no restriction on the foreign language of the applicant. After enrollment, all general foreign language courses offered by the University are taught in English.

(VIII) Applicants for all art majors must take and pass the unified art major examination organized by administrative authorities for admission examinations of each province (autonomous region or municipality); the University recognizes all unified art examination results of each province (autonomous region or municipality).

Candidates must attain or exceed the minimum control scores for undergraduate art majors set by their home province (autonomous region or municipality) in both college entrance examination cultural scores and unified art major examination scores. The University accepts the file submission rules of each province (autonomous region or municipality) for art applicants and allocates majors to filed candidates under the principle of “score priority with voluntary preference compliance”, admitting candidates from highest to lowest based on the official combined submission scores specified by each province (autonomous region or municipality). If a province (autonomous region or municipality) does not formulate rules for combined submission scores, the University shall rank candidates in accordance with Yunnan Province's scoring criteria for art examinations:

Comprehensive Score = Total Cultural Score × 70% + Unified Examination Score × (750 ÷ 300) × 30%

Candidates are admitted from highest to lowest comprehensive scores, with equal-score ranking governed by the *2025 Implementation Plan for General College Entrance Examination Arrangement and Admission of Yunnan Province*. Where submission scores are equal, candidates with higher unified art major examination scores shall be admitted with priority. Music Education (Normal Program – Instrumental Track) only accepts applicants specializing in piano or accordion. Dance Education (Normal Program – Ballroom Dance Track) only accepts candidates specializing in ballroom dance under the unified dance examination of each province (autonomous region or municipality).

(IX) Applicants for physical education majors must take and pass the unified (joint) physical education major examination organized by the admission examination authorities of each province (autonomous region or municipality); the University recognizes all unified (joint) physical education major examination results of each province (autonomous region or municipality). Candidates' total college entrance examination cultural scores (including policy bonus points) must surpass 60 points above the minimum control scores for physical education batches of each province (autonomous region or municipality), and their major scores must reach the minimum control scores for physical education batches of each province (autonomous region or municipality). Candidates shall be admitted from highest to lowest per the official combined submission scores specified by each province (autonomous region or municipality). If a province (autonomous region or municipality) does not formulate rules for combined submission scores, admission shall be conducted solely based on descending unified (joint) physical education major examination scores. Where submission scores are equal, candidates with higher cultural scores shall be admitted with priority.

(X) Secondary vocational school graduates from Yunnan Province applying for relevant majors shall follow the provisions stipulated in the *2025 Vocational Education College Entrance Examination Admissions Charter of Kunming University*.

(XI) Matters regarding applicants for Yunnan Provincial Government-funded Normal Students shall comply with the *Measures for the Implementation of Government-funded Normal Student Education in Yunnan Province*.

(XII) Applicants for ethnic minority preparatory programs must meet national admission policies for ethnic minority preparatory education. Candidates applying for the targeted special admission quotas for ethnic minority preparatory programs of the University must be ethnic minority students from the designated regions covered by the special quotas.

(XIII) No gender ratio restrictions shall apply to the enrollment of all majors.

(XIV) Physical health requirements for admitted candidates shall be implemented in accordance with the *Guiding Opinions on Physical Examination for Admission in General Higher Education Institutions* jointly issued by the Ministry of Education, the Ministry of Health and the China Disabled Persons' Federation.

VI. Tuition Standards

(I) All students shall pay tuition and accommodation fees on an annual basis. The actual annual charging standards for all majors of the University shall comply with the provisions set forth in the Document (YFGJG [2025] No. 348) jointly issued by the Yunnan Provincial Development and Reform Commission, Yunnan Provincial Department of Finance and Yunnan Provincial Department of Education.

(II) Annual tuition fees per student by discipline:

Philosophy, Education (excluding Physical Education), Literature and History: RMB 4,200

Agronomy, Economics, Law, Management, and Physical Education under Education: RMB 4,500 (Plant Protection: RMB 4,950)

Engineering and Science: RMB 5,000 (Chemistry: RMB 5,500)

Medicine: RMB 5,500

Theoretical Arts: RMB 8,500

Applied Arts: RMB 10,000

Accommodation fees: RMB 800 per student per year for six-bed dormitories; RMB 1,200 per student per year for four-bed dormitories. Provincial government-funded normal students are exempted from tuition and accommodation fees.

VII. Enrollment Procedures

(I) Upon approval of the final admission list by admission authorities of each province (autonomous region or municipality), admission notices shall be promptly issued to candidates.

(II) New students shall complete enrollment formalities on schedule with their admission notice and valid identification documents. Those unable to register on time due to legitimate reasons must submit a leave application to their affiliated school, with the leave period generally not exceeding two weeks. Students who fail to register without leave or whose leave expires without valid grounds (excluding force majeure) shall be deemed to have forfeited their enrollment qualification.

(III) Upon arrival for registration, the University shall conduct a preliminary verification of new students' enrollment eligibility. Eligible students shall complete enrollment and student status registration. If inconsistencies are found between the admission notice, candidate information and the applicant's actual identity, or any violations of national college admission examination regulations are identified, the

student's enrollment qualification shall be revoked.

(IV) Within three months after enrollment, the University shall conduct a comprehensive review of student eligibility in accordance with national admission regulations. Any student found to have resorted to fraud or irregularities during the admission process shall be deemed unqualified upon review and have their student status canceled; serious violations shall be transferred to relevant authorities for investigation and handling.

(V) Students with excellent academic performance and moral conduct are eligible for scholarships funded by the state, Yunnan Provincial Government, the University and social sponsors.

(VI) Financial support for students from financially disadvantaged families shall be administered in accordance with the *Measures for Student Financial Support Management of Kunming University*.

VIII. Graduation

In accordance with relevant national provisions, students who meet graduation requirements shall be awarded a Graduation Certificate of Kunming University; those satisfying degree conferral criteria shall receive a Degree Certificate of Kunming University.

IX. Miscellaneous Provisions

(I) This Charter shall take effect as of the date of promulgation. Matters not covered herein shall be subject to documents issued by the Ministry of Education and the admission examination institutes (admission offices) of each province (autonomous region or municipality).

(II) The Admissions Office under the Admissions and Employment Office of Kunming University reserves the right of interpretation of this Charter.

(III) In the event of any inconsistency between this Charter and national laws, regulations, or policies of the competent authorities at higher levels, the national laws, regulations, and policies of the competent authorities at higher levels shall prevail.
